

in the state of Minas Gerais. The closest record is ca. 167 km away in the central region of the same state (Sánchez et al. 2019. *Herpetol. J.* 29:219–229). Two species of testudines had already been recorded for this region, *A. radiolata* and *Hydromedusa tectifera* (Souza et al. 2010. *Biota Neotrop.* 10:129–138), reinforcing the need to preserve these remnants of these forest fragments. *Acanthochelys spixii* is considered a rare species due to the little knowledge about its biology generated by the difficulty of being found, so more data on their abundance and geographic distribution is needed.

Natural History Museum of Los Angeles County (LACM PC 1693; photo voucher). Specimen observed at 1555 h. New county record (Ballinger et al. 2010. Amphibians and Reptiles of Nebraska. Rusty Lizard Press, Oro Valley, Arizona. 400 pp.; Fogell 2010. A Field Guide to the Amphibians and Reptiles of Nebraska. University of Nebraska-Lincoln, Lincoln, Nebraska. 158 pp.).

HAMILTON Co.: Platte River, 4.5 km S and 0.7 km E of Central City (41.07594°N, 97.99272°W; WGS 84). 15 September 2014. Brian Hubbs. Verified by Neftali Camacho. LACM PC 1868 (photo voucher). Specimen observed at 1623 h. New county record (Ballinger et al. 2010, *op. cit.*; Fogell 2010, *op. cit.*).

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**CHELYDRA SERPENTINA** (Snapping Turtle). USA: FLORIDA: SAINT JOHNS CO.: Gourd Island Conservation Area, 0.9 km W of I-95 (30.07430°N, 81.50818°W; WGS 84). 19 March 2019. Madden M. Haag. Verified by Coleman M. Sheehy III. Florida Museum of Natural History, University of Florida (UF 195117; photo voucher). Neonate found in pool of water. New county record; 25.7 km southwest of nearest voucher specimen in Duval County (UF 193037). This note reports the first vouchered specimen from Saint Johns County, helping to fill a gap in the species' known range.

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**GRAPTEMYS PSEUDOGEOGRAPHICA PSEUDOGEOGRAPHICA** (Northern False Map Turtle). USA: MISSOURI: BUCHANAN CO.: canal off the Missouri River, 1.2 km N and 4.5 km E of Atchison, Kansas (39.57240°N, 95.07441°W; WGS 84), 239.6 m elev. 13 May 2015. Brian Hubbs. Verified by Neftali Camacho. Natural History Museum of Los Angeles County (LACM PC 1876; photo voucher). Turtle was seen floating in a slough at 1326 h. New county record filling a gap in the range (Johnson 2000. The Amphibians and Reptiles of Missouri. Missouri Dept. of Conservation, Jefferson City, Missouri. 400 pp.).

Amphibians, Reptiles, and Turtles in Kansas. Sternberg Museum of Natural History, Fort Hays State University, Hays, Kansas. 312 pp.).

Individual observed at 1445 h basking on branches in a pond. New county record filling gap in the range (Johnson 2000. The Amphibians and Reptiles of Missouri. Missouri Dept. of Conservation, Jefferson City, Missouri. 400 pp.).

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**TRACHEMYS SCRIPTA SCRIPTA** (Yellow-bellied Slider). USA: FLORIDA: SAINT JOHNS CO.: Wingfield Glen subdivision, 0.5 km W of I-95 (30.05850°N, 81.50332°W; WGS 84). 20 August 2017. Madden M. Haag. Verified by Coleman M. Sheehy III. Florida Museum of Natural History, University of Florida (UF 195119; photo voucher). Juvenile caught on the edge of a retention pond. County record; 57.3 km east of nearest voucher specimen in Bradford County (UF 101662). This note reports the first vouchered specimen from Saint Johns County.

**BRONCHOCELA MARMORATA** (Marbled Bloodsucker). PHILIPPINES: RAPU-RAPU ISLAND: ALBAY PROVINCE: MUNICIPALITY OF RAPU-RAPU: Barangay Carogcog (13.18699°N, 124.16722°E; WGS 84), 150–200 m elev. December 2015. A.K.S. Amarga. Verified by Jake Wilson Binaday. Lee Kong Chian Natural History Museum, National University of Singapore (ZRC[IMG]2.631; photo voucher). Individual observed basking on nearly tilted tree trunk between 0900–1000 h. First published record for Rapu-Rapu Island, Albay. This species inhabits lowland secondary forests, and also agroforests, forest edges, and agricultural lands including coconut plantations (Siler et al. 2011. Check List 7:182–195; Brown et al. 2012. Check List 8:469–490). Previous records from Catanduanes, Luzon, Polillo, Mindoro, Sibuyan, and Tablas (Siler et al. 2012. Check List 8:443–462; Binaday et al. 2017. Philipp. J. Sci. 146:339–351; Meneses et al. Check List 18:941–984; Uetz et al. [eds.] 2023. The Reptile Database. <https://reptile-database.reptarium.cz/>, 13 Oct 2023).
